

THINK BIG COMMUNITY CHALLENGE - JAPAN

Participant Terms and Conditions

1. Thank you for your interest in the Think Big Community Challenge (the "Event"). The Event is a 12-week event sponsored by Amazon Web Services, Inc. ("Amazon") and hosted in collaboration with our event partners including Creative Hut for Education, Wildlife Design Inc. and Brooks Sports, Inc ("Event Partners" and together with Amazon, "we", "our", or "us"). The Event is designed to teach creativity, digital and artificial intelligence ("AI") skills and sustainability business principles to students from numerous countries at eligible schools within Amazon's Think Big Spaces network. The Event program will include a flexible curriculum that can be completed in 4 to 6 weeks and a competition to design a hypothetical sneaker line with recycled materials using an education application. The Event details set out in Attachment 1 ("Event Details") contain further information and terms governing the Event.
2. By signing this document, you acknowledge and agree to these Participant Terms and Conditions for the Event as provided below, including the Attachments (the "Terms"). Please read these Terms carefully. If you are over 18 years old and participating in the Event "you" refers to yourself in your individual capacity. If you are a parent or legal guardian accepting on behalf of a person under the age of 18 participating in the Event (hereinafter referred to as "Child Participant"), then references to "you" means you on behalf of your Child Participant, where applicable, or your Child Participant in instances when discussing actions of Teams or Team Members (each as defined in Attachment 1 – Event Details).
3. You acknowledge that participation in the Event may require use of software, tools, and other materials provided by Amazon, Event Partners, TBS Institutes (as defined in Attachment 1 – Event Details), and other third parties, which may be subject to separate license terms, usage restrictions, and other terms and conditions.

Event Parent Authorization

4. For any Child Participant, the parent or legal guardian of such Child Participant must give their approval for his or her participation in the Event. If there are more than one legal guardians of such Child Participant, all legal guardians must give their approval. By signing this document at the end of these Terms, you acknowledge and agree to the Terms herein and consent to your child's participation in the Event.

Confidentiality

5. You agree not to disclose, copy, use, or directly or indirectly offer for sale any Confidential Information disclosed by Amazon or an Event Partner during the Event except for the sole purpose of participating in the Event. "Confidential Information" includes all information, material or data (regardless of the form of disclosure or the medium used to store or represent it, and whether or not any document has been marked as confidential, proprietary, or otherwise), in any form, whether tangible or not, disclosed or communicated or made available, whether directly or indirectly, by Amazon or an Event Partner to you, or learned or accessed by you, or to which you are exposed as a result of participating in the Event or otherwise through engagement with us.

General Conditions and Release of Liability

6. To the extent allowed by law, you agree to release and hold harmless Amazon and its subsidiaries, affiliates, employees, agents and Event Partners from: (a) any and all liability or any injury, loss, or damage of any kind arising in connection with this Event, including but not limited to: (i) your physical attendance at an Amazon Think Big Space; (ii) as a result of the Prizes (as defined in Attachment 1 – Event Details) won; and (b) any and all claims that you may have now or in the future associated with the Event or the Items, including without limitation claims arising from rights of publicity, privacy, or any Intellectual Property Rights. "Items" means all still photographs and all audio, film and video recordings that Amazon, any participating school, the Event Partners, or their independent contractors make of you, your voice, image or likeness in connection with the Event, including the right to use your, image, likeness and biographical information and any intellectual property rights subsisting in them. 7. It is a condition of these Terms that you have signed the release documents provided to you by the relevant participating school (the "Release") before you participate in any Event. The Release is set out in Attachment 2.
8. We reserve the right to cancel, change, or suspend this Event for any reason, including technology failure, catastrophe, war, or any other unforeseen or unexpected event that unduly affects the Event.

No Injunctive Relief

9. You acknowledge and agree that you will not be entitled to any injunctive or other equitable relief in connection with the Items or your participation in the Event.

Choice of Law

10. These Terms will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington, USA, without regard to the conflict of laws provisions thereof or other principles which might result in the application of any law other than the State of Washington.

Entire Agreement

11. This is the entire agreement between you and us with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any previous or contemporaneous oral or written agreements regarding such subject matter.
12. In the event of any conflict or inconsistency between the Terms, the highest or best standards or the term imposing the greater responsibility (as the case may be), will prevail.
13. If any court of competent jurisdiction finds any part of these Terms to be invalid or unenforceable, then that part will be deemed modified to the extent necessary in order to render it valid and enforceable. If it cannot be so saved, it will be severed, and the remaining parts will remain in full force and effect.
14. THESE TERMS PROVIDE US WITH YOUR ABSOLUTE AND UNCONDITIONAL CONSENT, WAIVER, AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ALLOWING US TO USE YOUR NAME, LIKENESS, AND OTHER PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS AND PRIVATE INFORMATION AND THE ITEMS FOR THE LIMITED PURPOSES SET OUT HEREIN. BY SIGNING, YOU ACKNOWLEDGE AND AGREE THAT YOU HAVE READ AND UNDERSTOOD ALL OF THE TERMS OF THESE TERMS AND THAT YOU ARE WAIVING ALL RIGHTS TO PURSUE US WITH RESPECT TO OR IN CONNECTION WITH THE EVENT.

Attachment 1 – Event Details

Eligibility and How to Enter

1. The Event is an in-person event open to students from schools in which an Amazon Think Big Space or an Amazon Think Big Workshop operates (each such school a “TBS Institute”). The Event will take place over a 12-week period between May 2026 - October 2026 during which participating students will: (a) complete a flexible program curriculum that can be completed in 20 classroom hours over a 4 to 6 week period during which participating students will learn creativity, digital and AI skills, and sustainable business principles (such as waste reduction, product lifecycle management, recycling programs, and sustainability material sourcing); and (b) participate in a competition to design a hypothetical sneaker line with recycled materials using a generative AI education application.
2. To enter, each TBS Institute may register a maximum of twenty (20) team(s) prior to August 14, 2026, consisting of the following individuals (together a “Team”): (a) a minimum of two (2) and up to five (5) students from the same TBS Institute between the ages of 13 and 16 (each such individual student a “Student Participant”); and (b) one teacher or faculty staff member of the TBS Institute to act as a team mentor. All registrations shall be made via the Event pre-registration page available at <https://www.amazonthinkbigexperience.com/communitychallenge>.
3. Each Team will complete the program curriculum provided.
4. Each TBS Institute may enter one submission prior to October 9, 2026 into the Event, which will include a presentation,, and supporting documentation aligned with the detailed Event guidelines available at <https://www.amazonthinkbigexperience.com/communitychallenge> (an “Entry”). Event submissions must be the original work of the Team and must be solely created by students without getting any third party’s help or using any third-party or Amazon intellectual property or involving any third-party or Amazon Intellectual Property Rights, excluding any Intellectual Property Rights in any software, tools or other materials provided by Amazon, Event Partners or TBS Institutes for the purposes of the Event only. Submissions must not contain, as determined by us in our sole and absolute discretion, any content that is obscene or offensive, violent, defamatory, disparaging, or illegal. No teacher or Team mentor can be involved in the creative process and will not hold any rights to the works or Entries.
5. We reserve the right to reject any Entry or any individual from the Event in our sole and absolute discretion.

Winner Selection and Prizes

6. A panel of judges appointed by us will review all eligible Entries pursuant to the judging criteria and scoring rubric below:
 1. Materials & Design Choices – 30 points
 2. Trend & community fit (local area links & design trends) – 20 points
 3. Use of Amazon GenAI & prompt Engineering – 30 points
 4. Presentation & Creativity (Showcase) – 20 points
7. The top 10 Entries as decided by us and our judging panel in our sole discretion (“Shortlisted Teams”) will be announced via the Event website following the judging process around October 2026. We will also notify the TBS Institutes of the Shortlisted Teams.
8. One winning Team will be selected from the Shortlisted Teams by us and the judging panel around November 2026.
9. All Student Participants from the winning Team will be offered: (a) the opportunity to experience demonstrations on Amazon technologies, get hands on training, and meet our leaders and the Event Partners teams; and (b) a pair of custom sneakers produced from the winning Team’s Entry (together, the “Prizes”).

10. Prizes are non-transferable and there will be no substitutions or cash redemptions. You acknowledge that Prizes may be provided by third parties over which we have no control. If the Prizes are unavailable or impracticable to provide for any reason, we will use reasonable endeavors to offer a substitute Prize.
11. The offer of Prizes is subject to the express requirement that the potential recipients of the Prize submit to Amazon all information or documents, including executing additional agreements or waivers reasonably requested by us to permit us to (a) administer the Prizes; and (b) comply with all applicable laws and regulations, including tax reporting requirements in the respective jurisdiction of the potential recipient (the "Prize Documents").
12. Refusal by any potential recipient or their parent or legal guardian to submit or complete any Prize Documents within the timeframe designated by us will result in such person forfeiting the Prizes, leaving them unclaimed.

Attachment A to the Participant Event Release - Privacy Policy

To the extent that Amazon collects, discloses, uses or otherwise processes any personal information of any participants in the Event, the following privacy policy applies.

1. Amazon is committed to protecting the privacy of any participants in the Event, and any parents or legal guardians of any participants in the Event: it's the foundation for a safe and trusted community. Our privacy policy outlines what information we collect from participants in the Event, how we use that information, and what choices individuals have regarding how and whether we can use their information. Since the Event is a learning and educational environment for children under the age of 18 "Child Participants", we take additional measures to safeguard Child Participant's privacy Amazon will handle personal information as described in this Privacy Policy.
2. This privacy policy explains our personal information collection, disclosure, parental consent practices and parental choice procedures with respect to information provided in relation to Child Participants and other information processing whether in respect of any Child Participant, any parent or legal guardian of any Child Participant or a participant of the Event over the age of 18 (together "Adult Participants"). Adult Participants and Child Participants are referred to together as "Participants" for the purposes of this privacy policy.
3. This policy is in accordance with the U.S. Children's Online Privacy Protection Act ("COPPA") and outlines our practices in the United States regarding Child Participant's personal information. For more information about COPPA and general tips about protecting children's online privacy, please visit <https://www.consumer.ftc.gov/articles/0031-protecting-your-childs-privacy-online>. Where applicable, in addition to COPPA, this privacy policy also addresses the information we need to provide to any Participant under the General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR") and other similar international privacy laws. For the purposes of GDPR and other similar international privacy laws, Amazon Web Services, Inc. will be the "controller" (or equivalent term under similar international privacy laws) of personal information collected in respect of any Participant at the Event.
4. **How personal information may be collected:** Information may be collected directly from Participants in relation to the Event. Amazon may collect information about Child Participants from their schools, and any Adult Participants including parents or legal guardians, who may provide us with limited information for their Child Participant solely for purposes set out in paragraph 6 below. In addition, Child Participants and other Adult Participants may share information about themselves during the Event. The Event will take place over online videos in which video images and audio of the Child Participants and other Adult Participants may be recorded. No information is collected directly from Child Participants until they are in the Event session. Child Participants and other Adult Participants may also share information about themselves during the Event session voluntarily. While Amazon expects all Participants and users to abide by our standards of conduct, please note that we cannot control or monitor what personal information you/your Child Participant or any Adult Participant shares with third parties, nor what those third parties ultimately do with that information, and we disclaim all responsibility in that regard.
5. **Event Recordings:** As described above, video of Participants during Event sessions may be recorded by Amazon, or by schools and Event organisers ("Event Recordings"). While we expect third parties to abide by our standards of conduct, please note that we cannot control or monitor what such third parties ultimately do with Event Recordings, and disclaim all responsibility in that regard.
6. **Purpose:** Amazon uses personal information collected, including images in film, video or photography, for administering the Event and for the internal and external promotional or marketing purposes of Amazon and any affiliates of Amazon. Amazon may also use personal information including Event Recordings to provide feedback for future events and programming and for compliance purposes.
7. **Consent and Lawful Basis:** Amazon obtains verifiable parental consent before collecting personal information from any Child Participant, or upon Adult Participant's consent before collecting personal information from Adult Participants. If a Participant, including a parent or legal guardian, is not using our services for any other purposes and does not provide parental consent or its own consent, if applicable,

within a reasonable time from the date the direct notice was sent, we will also delete any applicable Participant online contact information from our records. For Participants outside of the EU, where we cannot rely on our legitimate interest or other legal basis, we rely on Participant consent.

8. **Participants in the European Union:** For Adult Participants in the European Union, Amazon will use the personal information we collect as part of their attendance at the Event on the basis of our legitimate interests to properly administer and operate the Event. Amazon considers that we have a legitimate interest in processing Adult Participant personal information in order to allow Adult Participants to take part in the Event and effect its proper administration. When we are required to share personal information in relation to a Child Participant in the European Union in the circumstances set out in the section below, we will rely on our legal obligation to share this information with those third parties.
9. **What Child Participant's or Adult Participant's Information is Shared with Others:** We do not disclose to third parties any Child Participant's or Adult Participant's personal information that we gather other than as follows, in compliance with applicable law: (a) with Adult Participant's authorization, or in the case of any Child Participant, a parent's/legal guardian's authorization, (b) as required by any relevant law, (c) to third-party services who help us work or deal with the site or programming of the Event, (d) to conform to legal process, (e) to respond to legislative solicitations, (g) for assistance in fraud detection and prevention; (h) to secure the rights, protection, well-being or property of Amazon, Child Participants, Adult Participants or others and (j) in connection with a disposition of all or a considerable part of our business, resources or stock, for example, a deal, merger, consolidation, redesign, joint venture, task, or bankruptcy or comparable procedures.
10. **Parents' Control over Their Child Participant's Information:** Parents/legal guardians may at any time access or change the individual data that we have gathered online from their Child Participants. Parents/legal guardians may likewise solicit us to stop accumulation of information from their Child Participants, or to make no further utilization of, or erase, the individual data we have gathered online from their Child Participants, in which case, their Child Participant's records will be erased.
11. **Where in the World is Participant's Information Transferred:** Some of the parties we share information with may process it overseas. This means that Participant's information may on occasion be transferred overseas, including to Australia, Canada, Germany, India, Indonesia, Ireland, Japan, Singapore, South Korea, South Africa, Spain, the U.K., and the U.S. Some countries already provide adequate legal protection for Adult Participant and/or Child Participant's personal information, but in other countries, additional steps will need to be taken to protect it. 12. **How do we protect Participant's Information:** We are committed to maintaining the privacy and integrity of your personal information and use a range of technical and organisational measures designed to protect your personal information from accidental, unlawful or unauthorised destruction, loss, alteration and access. Before we share your personal information with a third party to be processed, we will enter into a contractual agreement with that third party imposing appropriate data protection obligations in accordance with applicable law and to the extent applicable to the nature of the processing to be performed by that third party.
13. **How Long Will We Keep Participant Information:** We will not retain Participant personal information for longer than is necessary. We keep personal information for long enough to ensure that, we can administer the Event and answer any queries, or where we have a legal obligation to retain it.
14. **What are Participant Rights:** Participants have rights in relation to the personal information we collect at the Event. Adult Participants and Child Participants (or parents or legal guardians of Child Participants under applicable laws) have the right to: (a) make a request to have personal information corrected if it is inaccurate, and completed if it is incomplete; (b) in particular circumstances, restrict the processing of personal information; (c) in particular circumstances, ask to have personal information erased; (d) request access to the Adult Participant's or Child Participant's personal information (as applicable) and to obtain information about how we process it; (e) in particular circumstances, move, copy or transfer personal information; in particular circumstances, object to us processing the personal information; (f) not be subject to automated decision-making including profiling where it

produces legal or other significant effects on the Adult Participant or Child Participant (as appropriate).

All of these rights can be exercised free of charge except in some very limited circumstances, and we will explain these circumstances where they are relevant.
